

Trail conditions now allowing a continuous uninterrupted course to the lower limits of Pole^{Heaven} Canyon. Arrived at car at 5:45 and soon on return trip down Hobble Cr. At mouth of Hobble Creek counted approximately 70 deer. Were found dotting the oak hillside in small groups, single, or in trailing groups higher up on canyon slopes. Their distribution appears to be a rather abnormal^{one} and is possible due to ^{being} harassed on the farm lands on the valley bordering slopes.

Approximately 500 Bohemian Waxwings ^(upper) on University Campus at Provo, feeding on the berries of the numerous oriental shrubs and bushes on the campus. Others rested on tops of the cottonwood trees along low canal on elm trees, and other larger trees lining the sides of the Bonneville delta here. The actual calls of these birds made a very attractive sight for many of the students here. This gathering at 4:00 P.M. snowed at 3:30 P.M. The same day but snow nearly gone from ground by 4:30 P.M. One dead bird collected (914) Bohemian Waxwing. Prepared and placed in collection here. Testis 1 1/2 m.m. ♂.

Made Crescent Ridge trip today. Crescent ridge on south slope of canyon, at Deer Creek dam site. This ridge begins about 5 blocks up canyon from the dam proper. Left car at dam at 6:25 A.M. and with skis crossed the canyon to the south side and gained upper newly constructed road, hence east to point where ridge leaves the highway. Started up ridge proper at 8:20 A.M. and with a consistent gait arrived at top of highest point at end of ridge looking directly down Provo Canyon at 10:50. Very bad and dangerous weather and only to glad to make return trip arriving at car again at the dam in the early afternoon. Next trip will be to record County photographically and make more specific notes along way.
