2/12/39. Made second solitary trip up Crescent Ridge to Vantage

Peak with the objective in mind of recording the east exposures

of Timpanogos, Provo Canyon and topography of the south fork and

Cascade Range. Last week I had made the trip with the intent of taking these shots but had failed because of the adverse weather conditions

prevailing at the time. Left home at 8:00 a.m., rather a late start,

with the skies clear and cold looking in the east and a few low dark

clouds in the western horizon. Stopped at Bridal veil Falls and

shadow. The contrast between the

dark confining canyon walls and the

apparently accentrated light inten

or whirls of snow dust racing up the pure white snow slopes sodded a touch of coolness to the setting. This view is always associated with a strong, freezing down canyon wind blowing down the Provo Canyon.
