the canyon draining this particular valley has an abrupt grade right to the edge of the basin proper. At this point observed nest of either red tail or horned owl. My suspicions are that possibly both the owl + red tail and even the goshawk use this nest. Nest placed in aspen group at south end of small basin. One receives a most unusual picture of Trumpanogas when standing at the east side of valley & looking west down the narrow canyon.

Left the basin and again took up course on the west ridge, following along the crest to its north terminal overlooking the widest canyon intercepting the Deer Cr. Ridge. In working toward the east to divide of this canyon paused to record a portion of Trumpanogas in vicinity of aspen Grove. This picture (3-3-5-39) will

indicate the mood of the day with Elk peak and main canyon of terraces above Aspen Grove. Also took no (4-3-5-39) in same vicinity. Crossed canyon and followed up hillside to W. E. trending ridge,

hence N. W. to high point of main ridge. Crossed a narrow elevated valley to main ridge leading directly north to my destination. On this main ridge saw a flock of 5 R. Mt. Pine Grosbeaks feeding or at least working through the aspen trees. From here
