

Dad, Ray Snow and myself made trip up Grove Canyon on mt. Timpanogos to collect a set of eagle eggs. The exact position indicated on reference picture ⁽¹⁻⁴⁻¹⁰⁻³⁹⁾ which was taken on a previous trip several year ago.

The other two nest used year ago and it alternate nest are also shown. Left 3:40 P.M. Skies clear and very little wind.

First switch back 3:57. Observed 4 nests in the cavernous caves

in cliffs on south side of canyon. Arrived at spring at 4:25. Ample supply of water. Crossover at 4:53 P.M. Two deer.

Proceeded up ridge to point where brink of cliff lined ridge flattens out. Here we saw an eagle (♂?) flying from the the N.E. toward nest and passed on about our same level. It came to edge of upper nest cliff and dropped down below nest. It circled around below nest for a few second and then lit in top of fir tree some 200' below nest. After about one and 1/2 minutes it flew up to nest in circles and lit on edge of nest. Remained for about 1/2 minutes and then it left (♂?) carrying a sprig of fir tree which it dropped shortly after leaving nest. It flew over the same course as it approached the nest on returning from the head of Grove the first time observed. It may have been hunting on flats above or on guard at the time we approached and this first visit to nest was in the form of a warning. After a minute or less after the ♂(?) left the ♀(?) left nest for 15 seconds, circled below nest and immediately returned again. She continued along ridge to where we could look down the west line of cliffs to nest. We were at the highest point on ridge. From here the bird could see us for the first time. The ♀(?) flew or rather sailed directly to the west in a very sneaking manner. At a point where old nest is located it made five interesting roller coasting movements up & down in great dives & upshots. It finally soared in right hand circles S.W. out over Utah Valley proper. As we worked down ridge to cliff where nest was located could see ♀(?) working toward Timpanogos high in sky. On arrival at the nest the ♂(?) left nest and flew N.E. up Grove Cr. and joined ♀ high in
