point would be an ideal place to make observations pertinent to study the cirque life below. On the ridge a second canyon from the northern peak observed considerable signs of overgrazing in the form of erosional gully in this canyon. However it was the only canyon on this slope that was so severely effected so it may be surface ^{topography} rather than overgrazing. at least the degree of erosion was not the same in the other canyon, which are essentially the same in topography. From top worked south to canyon & came up and on way took two more pictures. 8a-5-17-39 much like it 8-5-17-39 and 9-5-17-39, one of the cascades and the other looking up south fork. On the last ridge before dropping
