

down into the return canyon heard a pika. This animal was not associated directly with immediate rock slides. Took another picture. (10-5-17-39) showing pass described in previous part of notes. One last ray of sunshine has pierced the clouds to light a portion of the cirque wall. These clouds were however disappearing. As I descended ridge heard pika. Dropped down on to nest to the last flat in canyon & went up, as I was walking along near base of slide did not see or hear pika but when I stopped a pika immediately started to call. From this flat worked south to ridge looking directly down into Arvo Canyon. at 6:15 sun was off knoll at camp. on way down this ridge took a

picture showing cascades. could hear whines of the wings of the dusky grouse (?) as they sailed down from higher elevations. Arrived at divide at 6:25 and sat down on the east side of same divide to record a picture of the cascades and and watch for any signs of animal life that might cross the divide. The fault line is easily discernable from these pictures of the cascades. As I patiently waited for the evening activity recorded

the closing of a most pleasurable day in the form of a sun set on the ^{upper} ridge showing radiating rays from the interference of the clouds. no. (13-5-17-39). Shortly six deer came to pass to feed upon the salt soaked ground and pebbles left from sheep operations. These deer would paw the edges of the boulders and then get a mouth full of rocks. After getting salt from them they would spit them out again. These deer remained here until I had to leave at 7:10 whereupon they left at will and worked back again into the brush
