These pictographs show considerable antiquity both in design and age of drawing on surface of rock. In general they take on the basket maker style of drawing. No animal forms recorded, ^{by the Indians} other drawing are no doubt present here in this canyon.

Dr. Vasco M. Tanner, Wilmer Tanner, Mr. Anderson and Grant ^{and myself} Harris, made trip onto the Price country. The main objective was to collect a series of night snake and *Saphidopus intermontana*. Left at 2:00 P.M. Traveling from Provo to Springville recorded the robin, Evy sparrow, brewer blackbird and R.W. blackbird. Stopped at spring just beyond the Wasatch conglomerate in the narrow in Spanish Fork Canyon. At this spring observed an adult Woodhouse Jay & 3 young about same size as adult. They called continuously and followed closely behind the adult, A robin, *Eul. dorsalis utahensis*, sceloporus 3 inches long, mt chickadee & young feeding on cecadas, were also observed here. In 1/2 hours saw 10 sceloporus. Birch, willow, juniper, aspen and squaw bush are associated here at this spring. A red tailed circled above. At soldier summit saw several *Artellus armatus*. Bluebird at Castle gate. Stopped at the Peuce mine where Mr. Nielson reports the follow. (Mr. Nielson is a school teacher and has charge of the abandoned mine). He says that he took a rubber boa from top of cow shed on the dry hay. The hay was purchased from near vicinity. He took the snake into his house and next day gave to Mr. Hardy at Price. (Mr. Hardy at junior college) He also reports seeing one 2 blocks up lateral canyon among sleep butte. Blow snakes are
