

Stayed at S. Evans for the night. Riding around the river and canals at night disclosed the presence of *Rana pipiens* and *Rana catesbeana* by call only. The bullfrog has a very low-mechanical call not like any other native amphibian. Tam Evans reports seeing several rubber boa in his journey in the hills west of Pocatella.

6-28-39. Left Pocatella at 9:35 A.M. and arrived at Missoula at 6:45 P.M. Followed 91 to Butte, 10a to Drummond, hence 10 to Missoula. Swamp area near Harner was populated along side of road in burrow pits with about 20 black. Cr. N. Horn. Coats and several ducks. This area is very extensive with endless fields of *Juncus grossus* (?) and wet meadows. This valley of wet lands ends abruptly into ~~the~~ adjoining area of same valley that is dry and covered with sages and sands. Here the jackrabbits are numerous for first time. The contact of the wet area being so near may be responsible for the gathering here. We noticed that the jacks particularly favor dry sagebrush flats but associated with greener areas. As we entered the City of Dubois we found cricket barriers of tim about 8 inches high. The cricket infestations were limited to the area between Dubois and Spencer. They appeared to be concentrated in spots of about 150 in extent. Their cannibalistic tendency caused them to congregate in large numbers in road and thereby produced an unnatural number. The greatest numbers were found at mouth of Canyon leading into Spencer. Many horned larks gathered here to feed upon the dead crickets. This is the only place I had observed the horned larks and their presence may have be brought about by the cricket migration. Unusual number of *Lepus* sp. associated with this cricket area. Hawks few but more than found in Utah portion of trip. Circus at Spencer, Red-tail & Circus at Dillon, red-tail at Anaconda. Crow, magpies and blackbirds generally distributed but upon entering Montana they increased in numbers. This country is much like the Heber Valley country of Utah. Skunk at Dillon, *Citellus* from Montana line to Anaconda. The country through Montana are most
