

The cross section of shoe line was also taken at the peninsula point. The *Thamnophilus* were collected in such a situation. One thing that presented a very unfavorable picture was the depredations along the tide shoe lines where everyone was digging for Clams and destroying the oyster beds and other molluscan life. These shoe lines can only stand a certain amount of tramping. Left sea beach and ferried to Seattle from Bremerton on the Kalakala. At Bremerton the Secretary of the Y. M. C. A. took us on the Battle ship Salt Lake City, and through the navy yards.
