

7. Open position among Artemisia. 390806-114
8. Peripheral edge of service berry among dry leaves at base.
9. Among dry leaves under protection of service berry.
10. On west peripheral of service berry bush. (large clump)
11. Side of rocky outcropping near oak and artemisia.
12. Peripheral of large service berry patch.
13. In trail that led through dense clump of service berry.
14. Trail through oak patch.
15. Peripheral edge of buck brush on down hill side.
16. Side of Symphoricarpos and artemisia.
17. Peripheral edge of service berry clump.
18. In a very protected spot among the lower trunks of a clump of service berry. among dry leaves and sticks. It was at least 10 feet to the peripheral edge and open situation.
19. Exposed side. hill in trail.
20. Ibid. Protected area of service berry & artemisia.
21. Protected area of service berry and artemisia on ridge.
22. Ibid. Rocky area of ridge. Artemisia, oak, service berry.
23. In protection of service berry.
24. On rocky side of ridge near oak. artemisia & service berry.
25. Open trail under two service berry clumps.
26. Among small patch of oak 3' high and 3 foot high artemisia.
27. Lower edge of service berry on peripheral edge.
28. At entrance to a hole among the base trunks of a small service berry bush. Trunked 1" to 1 1/2". Service berry bush 4 feet high and occupied about 1 sq foot at base in the form of composite trunks. Center of ridge at north terminal where ridge dips abruptly to the canyon floor. Hillside here dry dirt, rocks and a few small artemisia.
29. Open exposure on side hill in trail. No bush within 12 feet.
30. Base of service berry clump in a more or less protected position, dry leaves + dry debris at base and near peripheral edge.
31. In center of oak stand at base of ridge among a continuous floor of dry leaves. Six feet to base of hill and more open exposure.

The picture no. 78a-8-8-39* will show the area or at least the upper limit of the research area, showing the rocky situation, the more or less isolated clumps of service berry, and oak. This picture combined with an aerial drawing of the ridge, will assist in gaining a more accurate picture of the area as a whole. The picture was taken looking directly south with big bald mountain in distant.
