

Here the ridge is supported with artemisia offering excellent coverage for *Taxurus*, if not too high, and meadows.

10:45 2 *Eutamias* calling

10:51 Base of abrupt rise in ridge with cliff outcropping. Buck brush eaten extensively by cattle.

11:06. First mahogany on ridge

11:10 Large and small flycatcher. The large one had a conspicuous white chin and the small one with conspicuous white breast confined between duller sides



11:15 Gophers active; H.T. Towhee

11:37. Conspicuous patch of chokecherry in a pass on ridge. Swift flew by & low.

11:55 *Citellus v. utah*.

12:00 Top of the next to the last knoll on ridge. *Eutamias* + H.T. Towhee calling. Gophers still active.

12:05 Several Black Balsam.

12:18. Collected a *Eutamias umbrinus* (6-8-9-39) on ridge among conifers, mainly black balsam on the west side & down 120' from crest. It was calling very busily. First one of *umbrinus* chipmunk observed so far, but expect to see more now as we are entering a more typical *umbrinus* country.

12:37. *Eutamias umbrinus* calling vigorously as we passed along in spruce & fir. Chickadees and nuthatch near and calling.

12:45 Following 40' down west side from crest of ridge. Ridge here still damp from rains of several days ago. Cooper Hawk done at nest.

12:50 Back on ridge and flushed 8 grouse (Dusky) feeding on ridge proper. 3 others observed down ridge about 200 feet or so.

1:00 P.M. *Eut. m. cons.* Worked horizontally to cirque now.

1:10 at depressional area on glacial platform on east side of ridge. Five hummers on slide (Sp?) None observed 5 marmots. *Eutamias umbrinus* groups representing 13 so far. Collected 3 of these nos. (7-8-9-8-9-39)

Crossed large rock slide below cliffs, past dry spring to next ridge east arriving at 1:50 P.M. Had dinner here and then went straight up gully to divide looking to the west country. As we worked up this gulch observed 15 hummers on rock slides where beautiful flowers were growing. They were continually racing & chasing each other and talking like juncos. *Eutamias* past by hummer but hummer did not resent its presence. Observed the following plants here: Indian paint brush (*Castilleja*) lupine; one of the
