at the last trap jumped a small cottontail rabbit from the Artemisia near the area.

This morning collected a Sceloporus bi. serriatus on S. east side of chimney rock on lower set of cliffs. It remained in position until approached within 3 feet & then worked into crevice where it remained and sunned itself until shot with flipper. Yesterday collected one on north side of chimney rock an early morning at the base of the perpendicular cliffs. Being in a shaded position and being early it was not very active. Approached within 1 foot & then very slowly and movement almost unperceptible place a stick over its back & pinned it down. Also yesterday collected one on rocks near trap 64 and saw 2 in talus rocks on east end of cliffs. They prefer the vantage points on large boulder at base of talus slope below the cliffs.
