ing than the other with conifers on south side and aspen & symphoricarpos on  
north side. A very crude illustration is used here merely to

make a crude associa-  
tion with the stream  
systems and to orient  
trap line for future re-  
ference. The trap  
placement is approximate  
with the creek channel  
in relative position. The  
specific description of  
the trap line will  
indicate the distance  
between the traps and  
their immediate sur-  
rounds. The entire  
length of line from  
no. 1 to 100 approx.  
600 (six hundred and  
30 feet). This  
research area is  
a mixture of the  
stream association  
of the higher Hudsonian  
zone and the Canadian  
It appears that a  
tongue of the Hudsonian  
zone in the form  
of the Engelmann  
spruce have followed  
down the edge of the  
stream and has in-  
vaded the Canadian  
zone in the aspen  
belt. This stream  
is in near proximity  
to the higher Trap-  
oonpe Cirque at its  
head, although no  
permanent stream in-  
vades this Cirque.
