This evening at about 6:50 P.M. observed 13 does and one buck within 400' from camp. They were grouped as follows:

1. large and one small doe
1. apparently lone buck with nice set of horns.
4. does of varying size.
1. doe and her two young fawns. Their heads just come to top of doe back when standing alert.
2. does with their single young

These deer can be observed at 30' and are very tame. They came out of aspens from both sides in the evening to probably drink and then feed in opening and then work back into edge of timber. Evening seems to be a better time to observe these deer than in the morning. The 5 above groups were generally distributed in canyon flats near camp.

9-4-39 Station 4. Timpanoche Basin. Many came up for a couple of days. Temperature this morning at 6:30 A.M. = 54° F. Bees flying at 6:10 A.M. Clouded with few blue spots. Looks like rain. After breakfast made inspection of research area A-8-29-39 at 6:50 A.M. as follows.
