Left cirque at 4:55 P.M. with traps untouched and under a covering of over an inch of snow and hail. Their frugation will justify leaving them until they are again exposed. On return trip did not find any mammal or bird tracks in snow on trail. Arrive at camp and soon had a white mans fire going in the shelter of a tent. Temperature at 7:45 P.M. = 40°F. Temperatures no doubt colder in open situation. All temperature reading from thermometer under protection of spruce at edge of creek. Skies finally cleared with stars shining before retirement. Wind now nearly subsided.
