

9:10 A.M. 2nd switchback. *Rudbeckia occidentalis* completely eaten by sheep. *Bromus marginato* mainly green. *Castilleja* eaten. 2 R. mt Grosbeak in top of Camfer, L.T. Chickadee calling. Siskins flying overhead, *Chamaenerum angustifolium* eaten by sheep, *Polomonum abiefalorum* brown and withered *Clematis angustifolium* greenish brown. Trail very wet with 2 Cent. m. cones.

Brink at 9:20 A.M. As I walked east along brink of cirque could hear the water absorption among limestones. At about the center of the brink took picture 2-9-15-39 with *Abies concolor* on left, Granite range in distance, a few hillsides below and *Pinus flexilis* on right hand side.

Practically all the conifers on the terraces are *Abies concolor*. One dusky grouse flew up from brink near Scout falls. Before leaving

the brink at 10:00 took a picture 3-9-15-39 of a *Pinus flexilis* on edge of brink showing valley below and snow covered terraces of yesterday. This snow covered surface was effected yesterday during period of hail and snow.

As yet the hail has not left the mountain sides. The conifer is by Scout Falls.

From here on attempted a number count and census as I worked up regular trail to the upper Timponeke Cirque. Left brink and worked across flats to main rock slide on east side. At 10:02. 2 Cent m. cones.
