12:05 At point where trail crosses over the gulch to the east. The last straight stretch supporting 15 sets of mouse trails, 10 sets of *Eutamias* tracks, few marmots near crossover (4 sets) near crossover marmot tracks numerous. Snow depth = 2 inches

12:07 Porby tracks wabbling from one side of the trail to the other. 1 pika called. Coyote tracks in trail going ^{up} ~~down~~ trail.

12:18 Trail on slide and near dwarf conifers. with 8 sets of mice trails. 2 marmot tracks near top of gully. Pika called. As I approached the top of the last terrace found the snow covering all exposures. Coyote tracks still going up. Red tail near bunk, Cooper hawk flew by. Group of juncoas, Grouse (Dusky) track. At 12:26 reached the cirque where government toilets are located. As soon as I left the terraces failed to find any activity of the mice. A short distance west of these toilets took a picture 5-9-15-39 showing the head of cirque with the highest peak of Timpanogas in the back ground. The picture clearly portrays the snow condition of the cirque. From here wandered to the west and south across the floor of the cirque and then returned to bunk and head of trail again. During the trip across the cirque made a few general observations.



5-9-15-39
Did not find any mice tracks on snows. Only one solitary trail of the snow shoe rabbit in cirque. Several marmot tracks wandering for great distances in cirque. Watch a Coyote from knoll east of the lake. It was walking when first observed across the lake and spring area to the west. It would turn from one object to the other in a very erratic course and pause to smell each investigation. It was not aware of my presence but very nervously trotted along at points as it leisurely worked its way to the south. Left it continuing without its knowing of my whereabouts. Several sets of tracks in cirque not older than the set made recently. Probably last night and earlier this morning. A Cooper hawk flew across the cirque from N.W. to S.E. and into Emerald lake country. flying about 50' above ground. Later a sharp-shin
