Also found the drumming call of the Sooty Grouse differs slightly from the dusky of Utah. A Great Horned Owl was also observed near the end of the ridge not to be lost from the last mentioned deer. From Bear Prairie trended south and west to the Washougal Highway and hence to Washougal and Vancouver. Was informed by native of Washougal that the trip represented a distance over 30 miles and via foot. Pictures censored by A.B.I.

4/11/43

Hiked to Yacolt from Vancouver. Approx 2 miles beyond Lucia Falls gained top of ridge north, hence east to point where railroad grade enters tunnel. Usual birds. Both species of grouse on hill. Many Sooty drumming.

no 1-4-11-43 of Mt. St. Helens (thru binoculars) and no. 2-4-11-43 of two large burnt logs with Helens in back-ground. This area was affected by the 1902 fire (Yacolt burn.)

4/15/43

Yacolt, Green Knob. Observation House, Gumbart, down Lewis river to Sunset Ranger Station, hence down Canyon to mouth Dale Canyon at point where main road runs by from Lucia Falls to Yacolt. Negotiated entire distance by foot. A.B.I. censored all pictures except 2. Birds found at Yacolt proper included: *Turdus migratorius caurinus*, *Empidonax cyanocephalus*, *Corvus b. hesperis*, *Phainopepla nitens*, *Oxyechus vociferous vociferous*, *Hesperiphona vespertina trochiae*, *Zonotrichia leucophrys*, *Melospiza melodia morphna*, *Scolecophagus*
