Cape Horn and Mt Zion. Beautiful vantage point at Cape Horn ridge below Mt Zion. If there is a vinder point along the Columbia River Gorge I would like to see. The down canyon winds strike this barrier with full force. From this point trekked north to village of Cape Horn and hence N.E. to top of Plateau of Fletcher flat. Found one single vantage point free of prevailing wind that offers a most interesting view of the Columbia River below. It is an exception to find an observation point that is free of the penetrating cold down canyon winds. I will always like to remember this situation.
