4-26-35

Dad and Dan Daynes collected a family of 3 wild cats in Skull valley, near the Secret Sweetstock ranch on east side of valley. They were taken in a semi-cave in set of falcon cliffs. Mother present. The cats were kept for about a week. On the above day their eyes were opened for the first time.

6-20-35

Collected a set of 2 turkey vulture eyes from nesting site of 8-8-31 in Hubble Creek.

Bredal veil falls in Cross Canyon. Taken from base of falls shooting straight up. It is under this falls that the water ouzel has placed its nest for several years. This year an adult bird dove under water and started to swim beneath the surface down a diversion canal before it realized that it was in a trap. The canal is about 1 1/2' deep and 2' wide. I walk along the canal directly above the swimming water ouzel.

1-7-20-35

10-24-35

Deer hunting trip to range of mountains west of Verbena in prominent range. This area is good if not overpopulated with hunter. Found a fawn with spot and not too old an animal. It was hidden in the high conifers near top of the range. It did not leave until I had nearly stepped upon it. Dad found a black obsidian point used by a prehistoric Indian. It was picked up on the west exposure at level of the divide. Found a Juniper tree (or pinyon) which was about 5' in diameter. In our canyon one finds some most unusual sized trees. Picture 1-10-24-35 is of me and deer.
