Left early this morning to make Deer Creek ascent. From the knoll west of the Hoover Ranch trended west and soon gained the hidden valley just under ridge to the west. Continued west to west

ridge and then followed north along crest. Returned same route. Pictorial record only except one or two notable exceptions. At one point on the ridge experimented with the snow cornices. They were so placed that there was no danger of a continued motion once having broken loose so I broke off sections involving several tons at a time and rode them crashing down. The impact and pressure is severe with a noticeable and loud accompanying thud with frequencies more than actual being involved

in the slide. The other exception is the case of 5 does and 1 buck deer that followed up the ridge ahead of me. The buck was concerned about his herd and at one point came charging down at me, not realizing that it was brave enough to continue and did nothing. He continued and I spotted an oak tree to climb. However his intentions were not as true as I supposed but sufficient enough to give me a good scare. Picture no. (1-1-3-37) is a general view taken on ridge above the flat valley. no. (2-1-3-37) show a cool background of Trump but warm deer tracks in foreground; the deer (5 ♀, 1 ♂) having passed only 3 minutes before. The cut-off track is of ♂ which charged down ridge. no. (3-1-3-37) is a shot ^{taken} directly east of Stewart Flats and shooting west at Mt. Trump.
