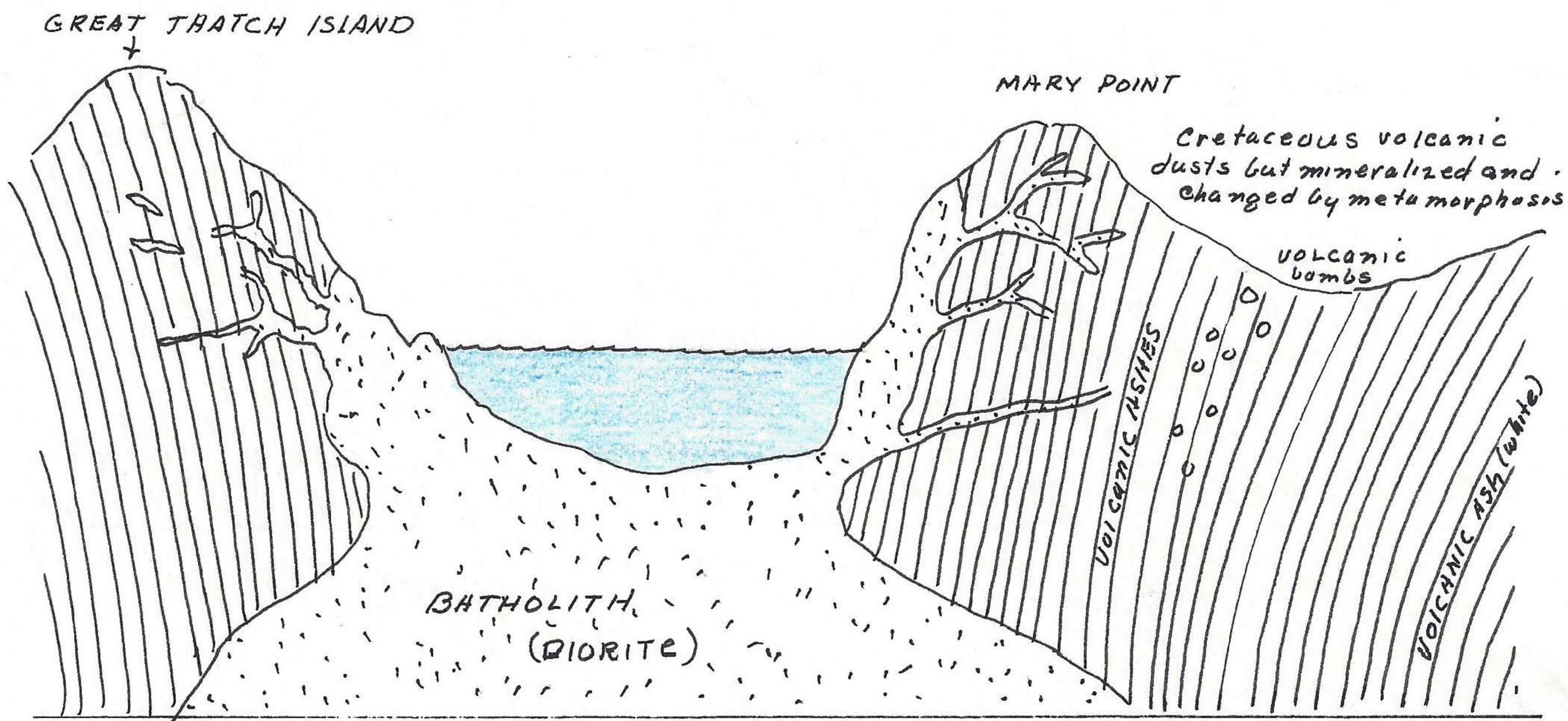
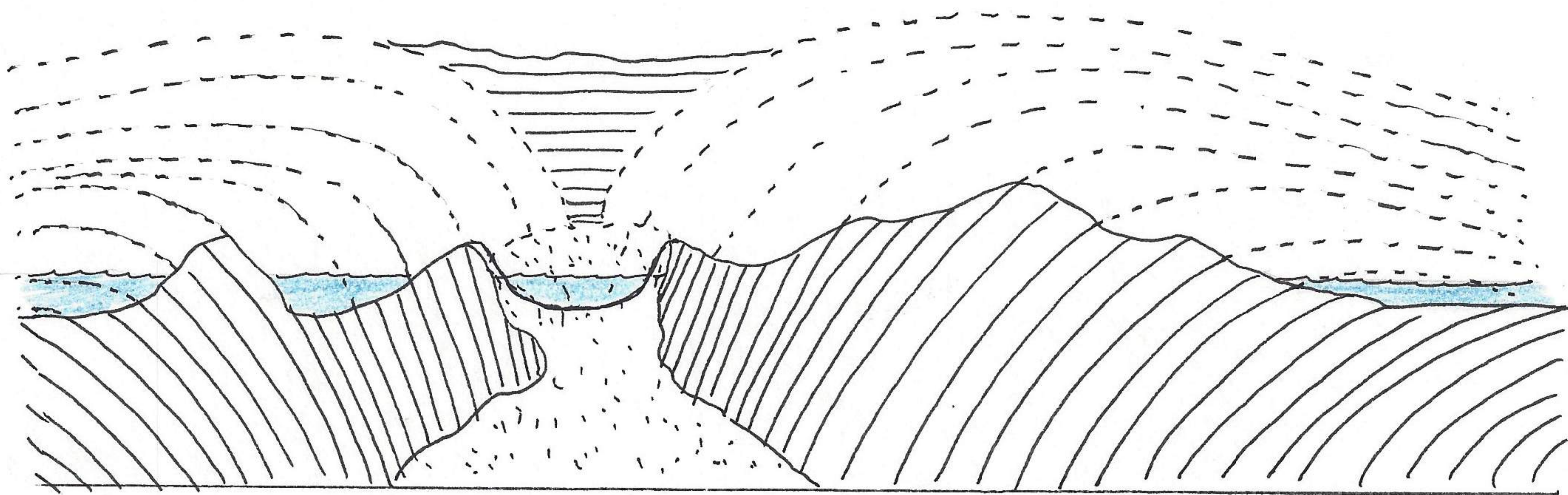


ash would indicate its nearness to the original source of the sedimentation of volcanic material. It is interesting to note that the sedimentary rocks are best formed in the vicinity



of the batholith. On either side and at least to the south the sedimentary condition is less evident. This area may be a local fold of a much larger one to the north. These rocks suggest or remind me of overturns in Utah along the Wasatch. The area of Virgin Gorda is the batholith, which has faulted up or bend above the old erosional level of the area. Returned to Lameshur by way of Counsel Bay and hence by jeep to Lameshur. Virgin Gorda and Anegada remind me of round domes of localities that are probably of different origin. I did not have chance to examine them at close range.
