

The two previous Ranas were from areas recently excavated for worm digging and were the same color as the soil. Ranas from clear ponds were light colored.

600501-3 Hyla versicolor

46 mm head-body length.

This frog was resting on the dried (last year) stem of a large weed near a stand of willows. The stem was inclined at 10°. Standing water adjoining. The 10 or 15 individual stems of willows were without leaf and some 200 feet from tree thickets. The only frogs calling were Pseudacris triseriata from among thick stand of orange trees recently inundated by rains. Rana pipiens also calling. Photograph

600501-4 of blue-wing teal which had been shot by someone and left. No 600501-5 also of this bird. ~~Two~~ Twelve lesser yellowlegs, 1 Wilson snipe, 1 virginia rail and 5 blue-winged teal also in area. All except one glass jug were filled with water. From under a log found 1 Microtus and ochrogaster ♀ with 2 suckling young (63 mm total length), one black salamander only 6 inches away. The salamander retreated into a crayfish hole also under the log. The log was within 4 feet of the pond. At 1620 Tennessee street in Lawrence, photographed Christ Pally, 600501-6
