Temp at 6:30 A.M. 50°F. This A.M. with complete fog on lake. Photo (600815-1) as fog was almost disappearing from water, taken from east end of island. Other pictures taken are:
 (600815-2) east end of island and lake beyond.
 (600815-3) Common loon on west side of island. This bird completely circumnavigated the island.
 (600815-4) Pally washing dishes.
 (600815-5) Chris & Pally washing dishes on east end of island.
 Departed Battleship Lock Island at 11:00 A.M. and continued east through several lakes and narrow passages to portage leading into Clear Lake arriving at the north end of portage at 12:40 P.M. By 5:00 P.M. we had reorganized on the south side of this 144th portage and had eaten our lunch. We left the portage at 5:00 P.M., photo (600815-6) showing the departure and in 1/2 hour were at Windswept Island in Clear Lake, where we made our second camp. The south half of this lake is relatively shallow with considerable vegetation in the main channel or arm of the lake.
