Continued observation at Centennial School on time of entry of the black swift into chimney. Numbers and time of entry on graph of Oct. 3, 1960. Only 255 birds entered chimney tonight. General observations are:

It is noted that the entrance into chimney was later to day and that there were more stragglers after the main group entered. Heavy black clouds in west which obscured most of the evening light, local groups of thunderclouds above. Flight entrance ^{to chimney} from west. Another check will be made at a later date to see if there is any correlation with migration or differences of time of entry into the chimney. It would appear that the clouded skies of tonight, although normally darkening the skies, interfered with the arrival time of the swifts. No noise made by birds inside of chimney.

LeCompton, Kansas

James Robert and I made canoe trip, from LeCompton to Lawrence, Kansas on the Kaw River. Left LeCompton bridge at 11:15 A.M. and arrived Lawrence at 5:00 P.M. Stopped several places along the course. Only two areas where too shallow navigation without running on sand. Birds and animals observed.

Spotted sandpiper - 12 individuals evenly spaced along river. No other shorebird noted along the entire route.
