Conoe trip from bridge at Lawrence to Eudora bridge along the Kaw River. James R & I made trip. Departed 8:20 A.M., cold wind, low clouds, rained last night and rain in store today. One of those miserable days for travelling by conoe because of cold north wind. When wind was across river the N side of river offered protection; small willow for 20' or so and high trees for 150'. These large Cottonwood trees are certainly a factor in wind distribution on the water. On stretches where wind could develop waves, the surface was whitecapped + took 2 men to paddle the conoe as course.
