Nov 11, 1960

At 3:00 A.M. snowed and by noon 4 1/2 inches had accumulated. Trees iced. Patter's Lake on K.O. Campus frozen. This snow was preceded by a cold rain which lasted all day Nov 10. Noted a Sphyrapicus varius, yellow-bellied sapsucker feeding in Austrian pine.

Nov. 28, 1960

Harold Murray presented me a Storeria dekayi telana (601128-1) which he collected on Nov. 1, 1960 at 3 mi. S and 1/2 mi E Lawrence (P.O.), Douglas Co., Kansas. This area is known as Hasell Bottoms. This snake was at the edge of a pond and when Murray approached it, the snake moved into the water and started to swim away. Day clear, warm, sunny and after one of the first autumn rains. It was collected at about 3:00 P.M. It measured:

head and body - 140 mm (when preserved Dec 26, 1960 it measured 142 body & head and 46 tail)

weight - 2.5 gms (it lost 1 gram in 1 month although it had <sup>mealy bugs available at all</sup> times)

There were 17 rows of scales and 7 supralabials

Nov 29, 1960

At 1620 Tennessee, Lawrence, Kansas noted the order of Command of four species of birds which fed on feeding platform: (from most aggressive to least aggressive).

red bellied woodpecker  
starling  
cardinal  
English Sparrow

Other birds noted on feeder are: juncos, blue jay, downy woodpecker, and black-capped chickadee
