

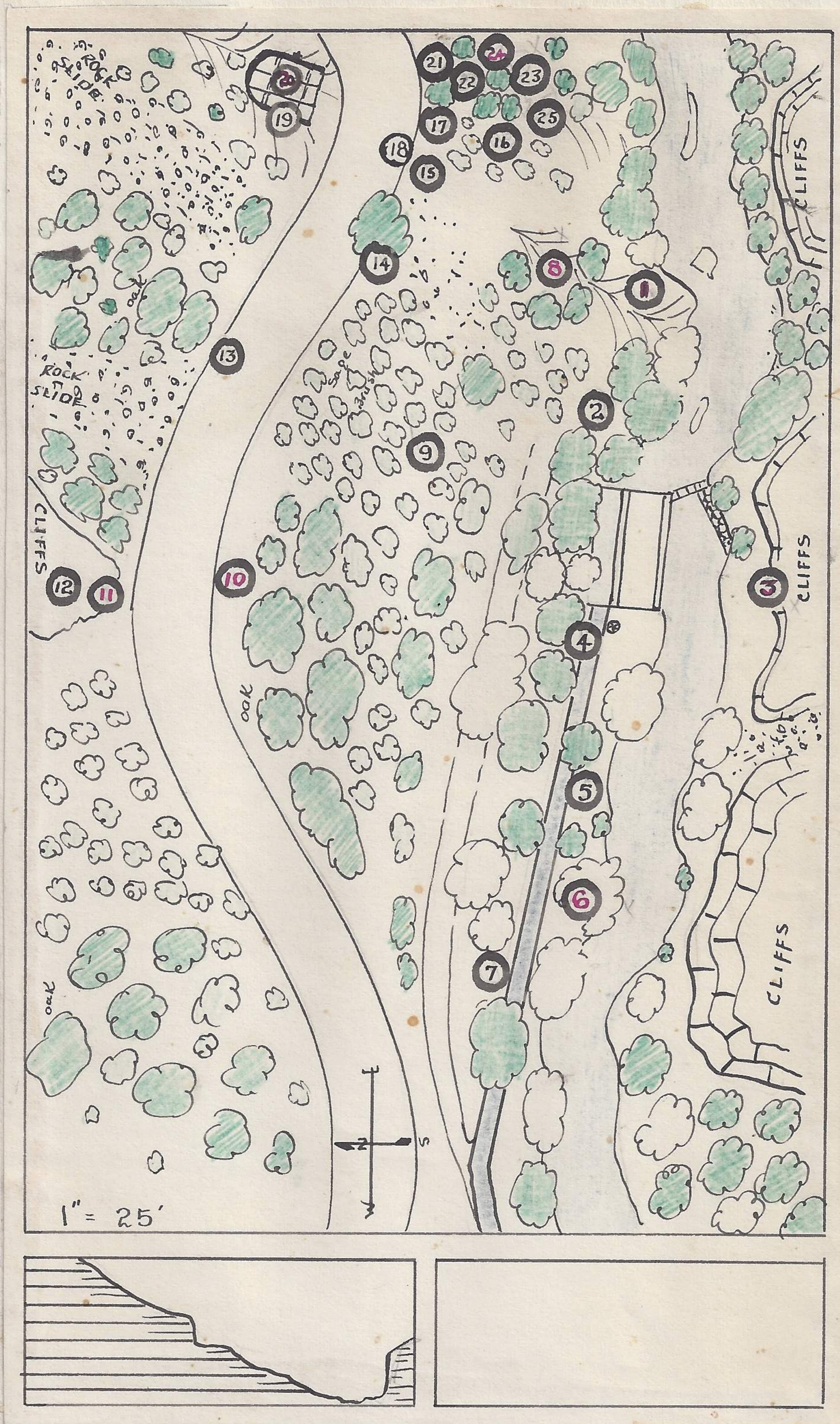

The definite location of the trap that produced results of the the above are: Trap no 1, along stream side habitat in dense growth among shady situation. The ground was thickly covered with a rich blanket of dried and decayed leaves and other vegetation. Trap no 3, near base of high cliffs about 10' from water. Taken from a well beaten path at base of cliffs. Trap no 6, at base of large cotton-wood tree near creek. Overflowing of stream banks evident on all sides.
