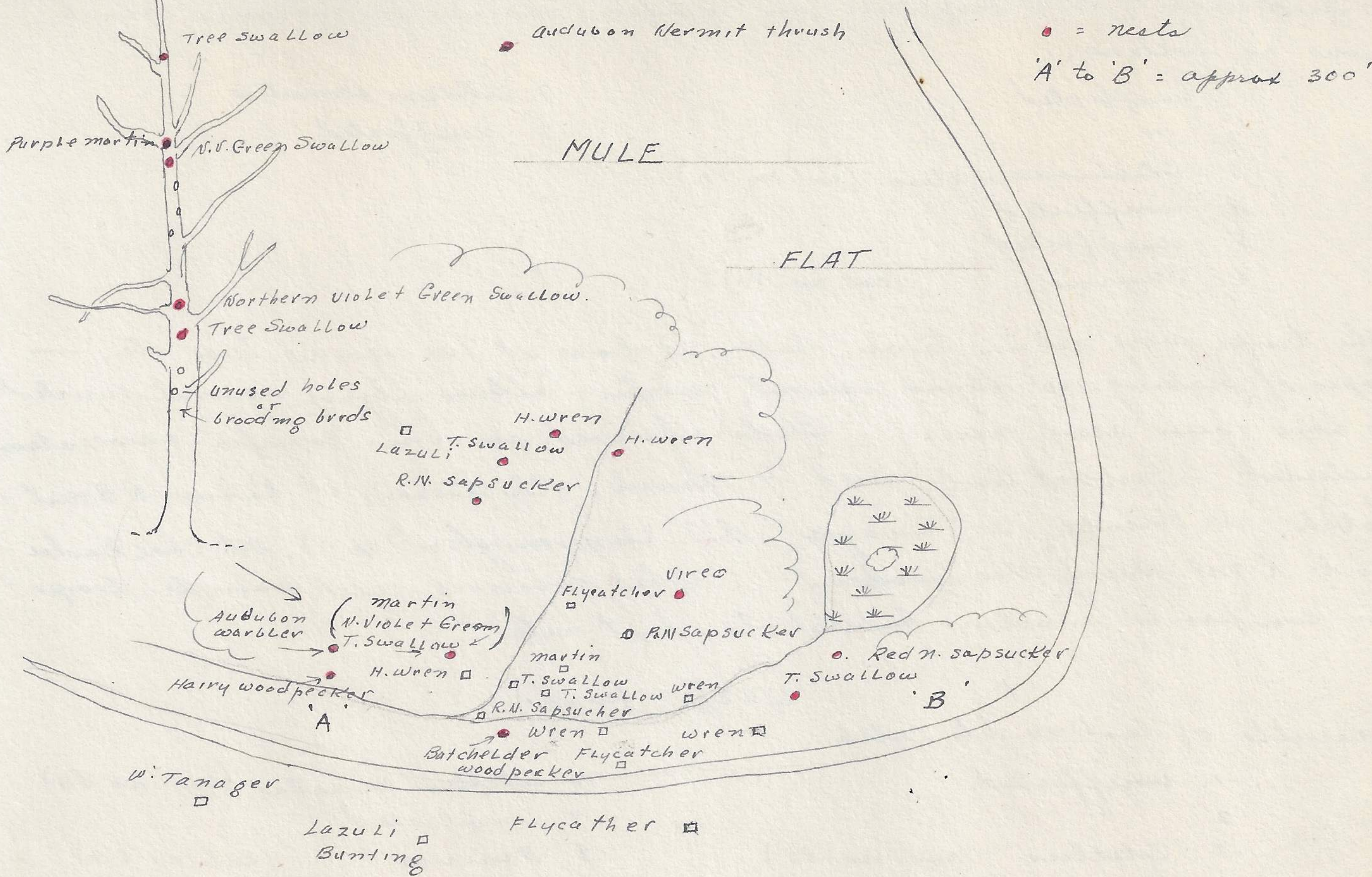
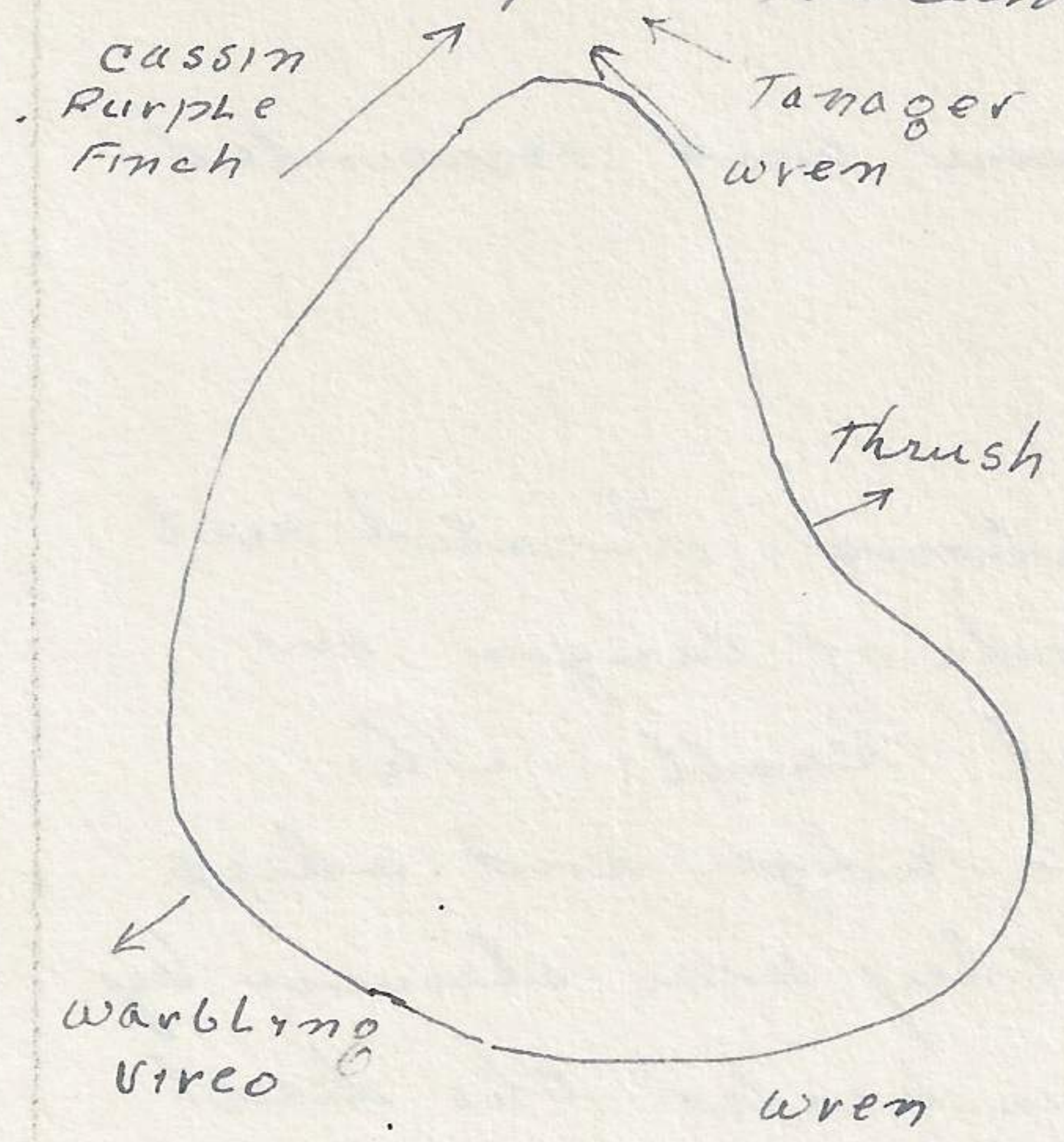


important factor The area examined is diagramed as follows



Examined 2 nest of the Aud. N. Thrush. One nest had 2 young & 1 egg. Outer part of nest of aspen and conifer twigs. nest lined with aspen and bark and rootlets. In albis concolor 4' high. Tree 9' high. One bird on nest and approached within 2 feet. Other bird near by with worm in its bill. Examined an Audubon Warbler nest of 4 eggs. Nest placed in aspen tree 21' from ground. (see diagram above). Nesting tree placed in moderate growth of aspen stand on hillside 100' from road. It was placed in lower dead branches hugging bank of tree. First visit saw bird near by. Second visit bird on nest. While examining nest the ♀ remained in upper branches. The ♂ did not show up at site. Nest 60' from martin & swallow tree. Left this area and walked up to salamander lake. and made a few observations.



The generalized map indicates direction of persistent singing birds. *Citellus armatus* around lake shore. B.T. Hummingbirds favored south end of lake. Robin, flicker, N.V. Swallow, Audubon Warbler, H. woodpecker, Phoebe, R.M. Creeper, martin, Mt. Blue bird, R.N. Sapsucker and western chipping sparrows presented themselves at the lake during our period of observation. Returned to aspen Grove and, as stated above, set trap line in conifers on south side of canyon.
