

1. Brood tail Hummer active at this early hour. 2. Western chipping sparrows pecking at branches at top of an Abies concolor.
 3. Audubon Hermit Thrush singing just beyond field at Aspen grove.
 4. Cut. m. consobrinus ran across trail. 5. Several peka and marmat in rock slides below first falls. 6. Macgillivray Warbler twittering in dense covering near falls. 7. A Lazuli Bunting sang from top of an aspen tree. 8. B.H. Grosbeak flew up from edge of trail. now near-ing first falls. - As we passed under an overhanging maple tree noticed a Hoary Bat resting in a maple tree about 400' below first fall. It was clinging upside down and facing the east. Trail directly below. We touched it and it left but flew around several seconds before leaving the area. The tent calipers very evident in mt. Selae along trail. White geranium near water, purple geranium in a drier situation. Marmat in rock slide bordering a snow bank 100' below first falls. Macgillivray Warbler at first falls. A Cut. m. consobrinus evidently the object of a hummingbird's aerial display. Only 30' of lower falls exposed. 9. a robin a second falls.
 10. Noticed a mertensia leonardii which was perfectly white in color.
 11. Citellus armatus above 2nd falls. 12. Porcupine tracks in trail below Lecture ledge. 13. Arrived at lecture ledge at 7:30 A.M. Citellus, W.W. Viers, Macgillivray Warbler and deer tracks at lecture ledge. 14. Two Macgillivray warblers singing. One ending with its typical chirp the other varied & not ending with the ♀ caution note. 15. G.T. Towhee on first switch-back cirque ward from lecture ledge. 16. ♀ B.H. Grosbeak on n. hillside flying by. Small animal tracks completely obliterating human tracks in trail. 17. Arrive at first permanent stream above lecture ledge at 8:10 A.M. Willows in Colkms in hollow above the spring. 18. Grouse tracks in trail. Continuing on up terraced as approached brink, a fly catcher and Citellus were found 300' below brink of the Hidden Valley Cirque. 19. W. Crowned Sparrows feeding in vegetation recently exposed from the receding snow banks. 20. One robin at brink.
 Arrived at Hidden Lake Cirque at 10:15 A.M. Temperature then 64° F The white Crown Sparrows were singing all along the trail from about 600' below the brink to the cirque proper. Observed many in cirque proper. 5 robins in Hidden Lake Cirque. The W-Cr. Sparrow fed among the marsh marigolds at the edge of the dwarfed conifers. 2 flickers and several bluebirds were present. A wood pewee fed on insects along the meadow and in the conifers. Yellow buttercups followed closely in barren areas at receding edge of snow. First lake just beginning to clear, otherwise quite wintry as yet. An adult marmat at this lake ran several hundred feet to its den. 2 young marmots at winter den near lake. Frequently heard Clark nutcrackers. Pine siskins flying from tree to tree in pairs or groups of four. Watched a chipping sparrow feed through the marsh marigold eating & pecking off the insects. ♂ & ♀ actively feeding.
