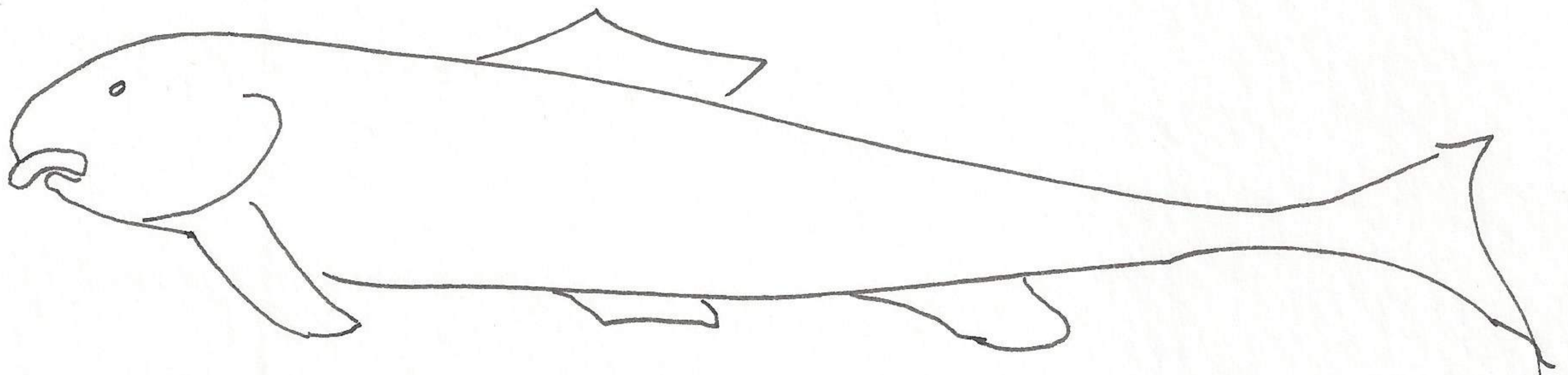
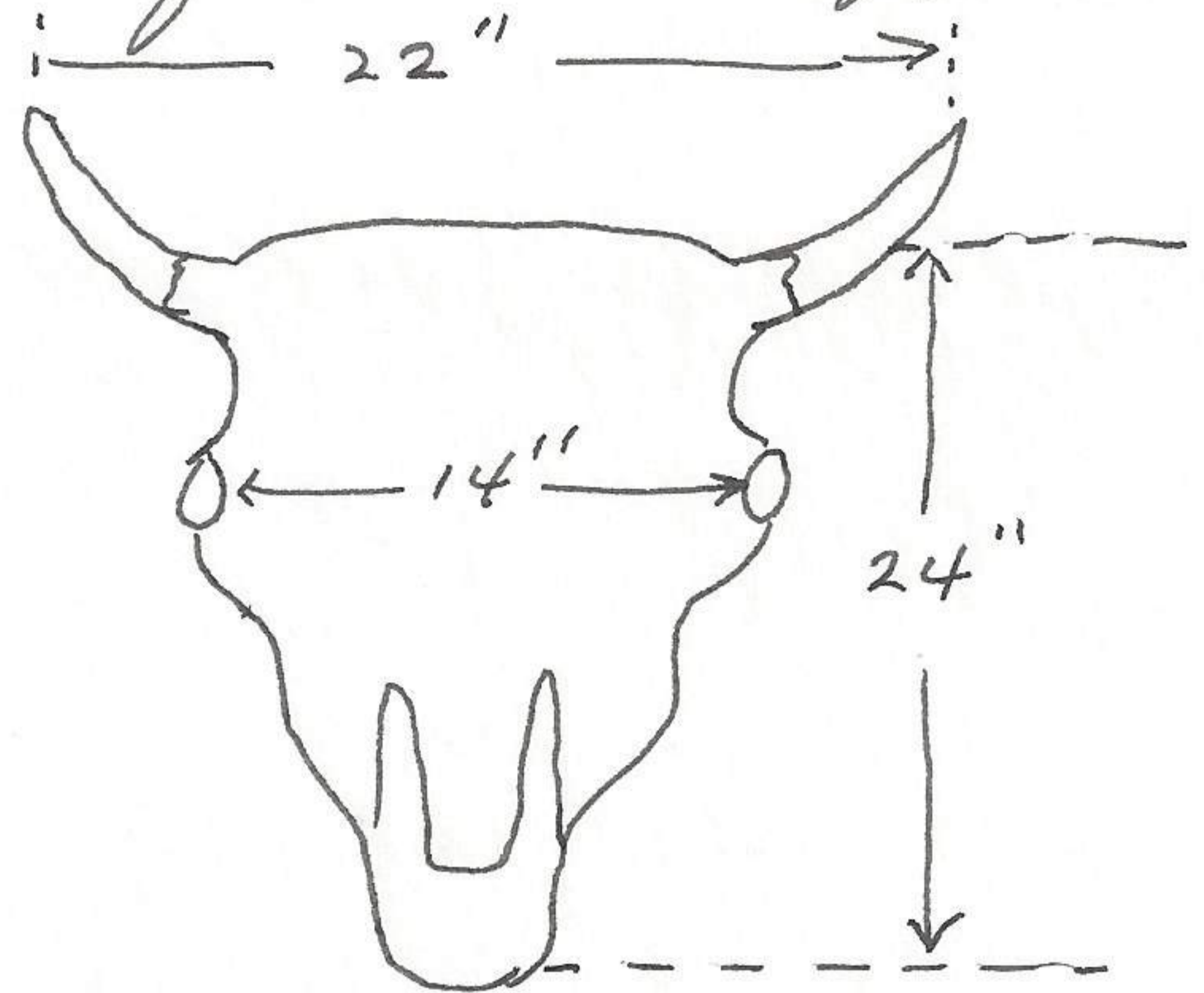


Bear Lake, Idaho-Utah

Aug 4, 1937

Packed and hiked around the circumference of Bear Lake from N end, clockwise ^{back} to N end. Camp enroute 2 nights, one on E side & one on S. end. On east side of lake at about 1/2 way down lake found a buffalo skull in shallow water.

There was other bone in the water but not easily accessible. I would judge that other buffalo skull could be located in periods of shallow or low water level of the lake.



This fish was found dead along shoreline:
 12 rays in dorsal fin; 9 rays in anal fin.
 mouth inferior. head 1/5 total length. width of width into length is 5 times, 12 uppers, scales 1/4 inches long, 64 scales on lateral line. South end of lake with considerable beach and impounded water beyond of cattail. Returned to Hayward's home at near Paris Idaho on NW end of lake.

Deep Lakes, Idaho (west of Bear Lake)

Aug 7, 1937

Set up camp at Deep Lakes, one of the most beautiful camp sites to date. Trapped and prepared representative mammals & birds from this area. Left the lakes on Aug. 12 for Provo, Utah, having encircled the Uinta Mountain, on a collecting expedition.
