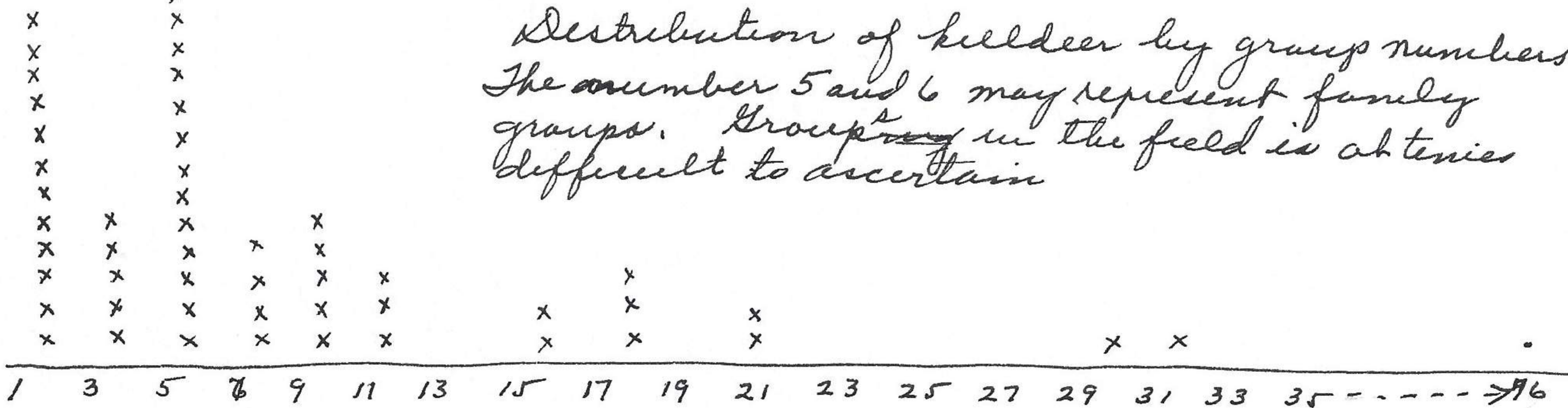

Dingman's Crossing, Wabarusia River to Linwood via Kaw River.

Nov. 8, 1969

Made canoe trip from Dingman's Crossing down Wabarusia River to Eudora to Kaw. to Linwood on Stranger Creek. Left bridge at 9:55 A.M. Sky 50% in high cirrus clouds with rest of sky a clear blue. Considerable ground fog because of lack of wind. air 53° F. water 44° F. 9:58 red-bellied woodpecker will keep complete record of all birds to mouth of Wabarusia and then only waterbird and river associated forms and unusual occurrences. yellow shafted flicker calling. meadowlark singing beyond riparian community. 10:00 red-bellied woodpecker calling. 10:08 great horned owl left limb of tree above water and flew down stream, and alighted in high cottonwood tree. 200' 10:10 2 black-capped chickadees; 2 titmice, yellow shafted flicker.
