

- 11:40 Wind still blowing up canyon but warm on the side of cliff.
- 11:40 Another Mlch Jay arrived in fir below  
Heard Hummer
- 11:42 Jay remains below flying from one tree to another.
- 11:45 Left station with the Swifts still maneuvering about and calling continuously. Swallows still commanding the front part of Cav.
- 11:45 Jay left when Sparrow Hawk lit in stand of fir below. Jay scolding and the Hawk screaming.  
Heard Hummer.
- 11:46 This station is an excellent vantage point for observations both up canyon in upper drainage & canyon proper.
- 11:55 On top again at highest point looking into canyon & valley below
- 12:00 While standing on edge saw falcon leave tree roost on north side of smaller ledge about 150' down west ridge of battle creek. It flew up and circled overhead crying continuously. Investigated falcon roosts, two near each other on side of cliff then examined two likely nesting sites on main cliff below point. One is in a fracture 20' high about 120' east from perches a highly coated with lichen and one a little nearer lookout perch, being a small recess with overhanging ledge. The falcon screamed continuously from time I arrived until leaving. Particularly concerned when near nesting sites and would dive at these points. Did not see eggs or young but am satisfied that by the actions of the birds a nest is certain near at hand.
- 12:20 Leaving top & falcons behind.
- 12:21 Two Cotton tails on west exposure in thickly covered rocky sidehill not more than 120' from falcon perch.
- 12:22 300 feet south of rim found camp site having been used this spring.
- 12:23 Leaving ridge and working down to divide. Towhee scolding to left.
- 12:24 Pheasant calling
- 12:26 Spurred Towhee calling & singing on north one scolding on south.
- 12:27 Atmospheric Thundering beginning, sounding like some distant blasting.
- 12:28 On divide
- 12:29 Cooper's Hawk flew over divide behind me <sup>40'</sup> and flew 200' down south trending canyon out of site.
- 12:30 Virginia Warbler singing 50' to left <sup>oak</sup> on approach flew 30' to another oak, worked up to top branches and started singing.
- 12:30 Virginia Warbler singing to the south, approached, passed & left still singing
- 12:33 Two Virginias warbling to east 400'. Two Chipping Sparrows singing in locust manner.
- 12:34 Leaving Divide
- 12:38 Worked around edge and now at head of 2nd valley. Wind blowing in greater velocity, Skies clear.
- 12:39 One Virginia Warbler warbling and one Chipping Sparrow singing locust style to left.
- 12:42 Hummer passed N.W along mountain escarpment.
- 12:42 sp. Towhee scolding to left in oak
- 12:43 Two mourning doves left ground and were loath to leave vicinity flying from one tree top to the other. Heard distant call of mourning dove.
- 12:45 Virginia Warbler ~~warbling~~ chirping in oak & feeding at base of trees 20 feet off trail to right.
- 12:46 Spurred Towhee singing on escarpment to left.
