

1:42. Green-tail loath to leave trail six feet distance. Stopped to adjust note-book or would have missed another G. Tail feeding with this one quietly & unnoticed. Spurred Towhee stopped scolding to gain top of oak to sing. Flew to another tree 60' away & sang

1:45 Pheasant calling from flat below over edge of flat. Winds still blowing but warm atmosphere.

1:46 Magpie warning on approach to spring. Pheasant calling 100 feet above spring. Two Virginia Warblers flew from area

1:47 Two Virginia warblers warbling & chirping
1:50 The chokecherry 100' above spring has well developed leaves but seeds ^{+ flower receptacles} in 2 inch lengths but no individual flowers as yet. Maple much more developed than oaks.

1:52 Arrived at spring.

1:53 Arrived at camp. Jack Rabbit left near camp and hopped quickly up over escarpment.

1:56 Hummer passing west, calling

2:00 Pheasant calling & drumming 300N-E

3:22 Dishes washed and leaving camp to make station over at dry canyon for selective recording, particularly change in songs & activity with the change in time of day

3:28 200' east of camp along escarpment saw 1 Virginia Warbler chirping at 20', chickadee silent and feeding, 1 Sp. Towhee scolding & calling

3:29 Pheasant drumming & calling N.E from camp

3:30 Virginia Warbler chirping to south.

3:31 Pheasant calling from same area as (3:39)

3:31 About 400+ feet ~~to~~ east of spring on ridge leading down to cliffs in Dry Canyon and at a point where one can see up Dry Canyon for first time after leaving camp is an area 190' by 200' is completely covered with wild onions. The area looks like a new grain field or lawn. The dying tips of the leaves are brown & yellow and give a yellow hue to a field that would otherwise be a beautiful green in contrast to the old and subdued colors of the immature oak. The area occurs on the ridge and is more or less flat. Between the individual plants the soil is dry & cracked but at one time, evidently was rather moist. The peculiar odor was very noticeable.

The field extended down hillside & ridge to the south for some distance.

3:33 Pheasant calling & drumming from same area as (3:39)

3:35 Several Towhees singing in Dry Canyon Drainage below Big Baldy.

3:45 Spurred Towhee scratching in leaves and did not leave or object when passing 20' away
3:35 Heard Woodhouse Jay.

4:00 Arrived at point of cliff in

Dry Canyon to establish station for selective observations. The most easterly extension of upper cliffs looking down both & up
