

Canyon. On arrival a Cottontail ran from cliff rose on ridge down to edge of cliffs. Two marmots, one running down rock slide ^{directly} below cliffs on west side of canyon while one feeding on east side ^{of canyon}, not more than 100' from falcon nest. Prairie falcon in evidence calling and diving

4:20 Flicker calling in bottom of canyon directly below.

4:30 Moved up hill to a point where could hear both sides of cliffs for songs.

4:50 Falcon left

5:10 The two red-tails lit upon oak above ^{nesting} cliffs of. One bird sailed down to nest the other flew across canyon and lit on cliffs opposite nesting cliffs.

5:55 Marmot calling for first + last time below.

6:00 Swifts varying from 2 to 6 in air at one time.

6:02 Falcon returned, flew around canyon not approaching nest except flying by after 10 minutes of sailing around canyon. He held a *E. D. Utahensis* in claws. head first and tail streaming out ^{behind}.

6:14 Female came out of ~~nest~~ nest in cliff and flew after male. male lit on side hill on dirt & ♀ took chipmunk and flew to point on cliff. She carried the chipmunk in same manner as ♂. Could not see point of cliff because of ridge that intercepted the line of vision but soon one bird flew across canyon into nest with part of the chipmunk then the other flew across with entire animal and went into fracture where nest was situated. The first bird flew out on second birds arrival. He circled around & soon I lost his the site of his presence. Nest on east side of canyon at on face of high perpendicular cliff. at north end and upper limit of of this cliff is a perpendicular fracture the entire height of the cliff. The nest is 10' from top of cliff down this fracture in recess.

6:24 Rock squirrel on ledge below

6:37 Crows appeared and sailed in spiral upward to the north.

6:50 Mourning doves beginning to fly around.

7:02 Marmot feeding on east side of canyon below & down canyon from falcon cliff.

7:06 Observed deer working down ~~ridge~~ ridge on east side of Dry Canyon. just down ridge from prominent ^{isolated} cliff near top of ridge. evidently coming from east side of ridge.

7:17 4 deer working out ^{from} bedding ground a little north on a level on other side of canyon.

7:30 Deer that crossed ridge at (7:06) is now at water at bottom of canyon directly below from where he first came over ridge

7:35 Deer through drinking & now working back on hillside

7:37 The four deer are now feeding near point where observed yesterday evening.

7:40 Seven deer feeding on ridge opposite Big Baldy to the east. Two near the top of ridge and five near bottom of canyon near head of canyon

7:48 Left station at 7:50.

From 4:15 to 7:30 from station as above kept separate record of the occurrence of the pheasant as to its distribution told by calling. The upper drainage below Big Baldy down to last conspicuous cliffs on Dry and ~~from~~ constituted the upper area while the foothills & valley up to this
