Observations and recordings.

mileage reading at Pravo before leaving 12517
made early start and followed 91 to Nephi then
over to 89 hence to Ephraim and Monticello. Saw Citellus mollis mollis near Sterling, San Pete Co, for the first
time since leaving Pravo. They appeared to be very
numerous and were seen running from one side of the
highway to the other. Passed through Gunnison, Salina,
Aurora and left Highway 89 at Sigurd. Turned off at
Koshareem reservoir and followed road leading to
Fish Lake turn-off. Gaining Awapa Plateau found
a Crotalus viridis leucostriatus on highway. It measured
880 mm in length. From this point one looks to the east
and south over an endless succession of rolling hills with
good cover of sagebrush but lacking juniper or pinyon. To
the west one looks down into Grand Valley far below.
