Soon had these specimens prepared after returning to camp and after lunch set out with gun and traps. Planned to set traps on east bench and to collect specimens to compensate for terrible catch of this morning. George ^{Burt} Miller & myself made trip with Miller shouldering gun. General itinerary included trip across bench, ^{down} Cohala Canyon and tank canyon leading to small natural bridge and capped pinnacle.

Left camp at 3:05. Quail calling and one seen setting in top of willow tree bordering stream near junction of Sulphur Creek and Fremont. Temperature over cast skies,

- 3:15 Two Sceloporus
- 3:20 Crickets calling continuously along course.
- 3:21 Chipmunk ran up hill over boulder covered hillside jumping from rock to rock. It was hard to approach but stopped frequently to look back. Hand from the N. E.
- 3:25 (661) Collected above Eutamias. It was eating juniper berries at the time. The slope on which this specimen was taken represents the north end of the elevated bench ^{which lies} east & south of the Sulphur - Fremont Cr. junction. The north end of this bench is covered with round lava boulders which have pelleted down as the Fremont eroded the once ancient floor level. Juniper & Ephedra are found on this side of bench. with Fremont river below and the flat ancient floor level at top of hill.
- 3:27 Sceloporus
- 3:28 Eutamias near prominent & massive yellow sandstone
