


Since above Census mallards have now accumulated to approx. 4000 all along dam but mainly near gates. Included in ducks observed are 1 pintail, 18 green-wing teal, 4 coots, 6 male and 9 female common goldeneyes, 10 gadwalls in one group, 2 ♂ + 2 ♀ baldpate, 2 horned grebe, 1 pied-bill grebe. It is interesting that there are no lesser scaup.

Returned to W end dam at 95.9 at 10:00 A.M. and now No. 96.1
redtail, 96.3 no ducks in w side of lake where yesterday they were
mainly collected. Ring-billed gulls flying along west side of lake at

approx. 1 per $\frac{1}{10}$ mi. " 97.0 Bluejay, " 97.2 right to peninsula. On
right in area of heavy summer camping & Eng. Sparrow nests in one 20'
high elm tree. Shrike. 2 crows along beach. 18 mallards flying

S. 97.6 N.E peninsula and now travelling clockwise. 64 ringed -
billed gulls in bay to N. resting on water. From here can see mallards
extending N to Rock Creek Causeway and with this number in addition
to those to S of here make up the equivalent number observed yesterday.

Ice in droplets  on banks at water edge but not on rocks.
