

Finished work here at station 2 shortly after noon meal and by 3:30 P.M. were ready to leave for the Aquarius Plateau. The object was to record all birds & animals seen and the beginning of the higher vegetation as we first run across it on trail and to associate observations with the mileage meter and time. Our itinerary and destination are Torrey → thru around road to east of high aquarius to Steep Creek on the S. E. side of mountain.

- Left Station 2 - at Torrey at 3:35 P.M. with mileage at Cemetery 01.3.
- 03.9. Crossing Fremont river. This county we have just passed through is of the juniper - pinyon association with the valley being formed between the monoclinal ledges & small buttes. Have seen 4 bluebirds, Robin, Flicker & Ponderosa pine, bush at 05.3.
- 05.4. Cacti dominate the fields are are yellow in color.
- 05.8. Rock wren in boulder along side of road. The pinyon & juniper are profusely found on both sides of road with the pinyon in dominance. Sage found also among trees.
- 06.7. Bluebird
- 06.8 Jack rabbit
- 08.5 Town of Grover. Birds seen at Grover while passing through are the Brewers Blackbird, Robin & English Sparrow.
- 09.0 Raven
- 09.3 Jack rabbit.
- 09.4 Sparrow Hawk. now passing among the junipers & pinyons. and they appear to be closer together.
- 09.5 Eutamias
- 10.1 Entrance to Powell National Forest with the Ponderosa Pine coming into the picture. Birch line the stream banks. Heard thrush.
- 10.8 Few red cedars but pinyons dominate. Yucca seen for first time. Birch completely bordering stream.
- 11.0 Carcass Creek. Thrush singing. aspen along creek. yucca patch on hillside. Gilia in blossom. Chrysothamnus & Artemisia present. Several evening primrose in blossom.
- 11.5 Good stand of Ponderosa pine. Several yucca.
- 11.9 Single juniper and several yucca.
- 12.2 Good stand of Ponderosa pine. and elderberry bushes.
- 13.0 W. Throated swift & bluebird.
- 13.4 Eutamias adustus.
- 13.4 Spruce (?)
- 13.6 Eutamias (sp.)
- 13.9 Saw mill at 4:20 P.M. and Collospermophilus at camp.
- 14.0 Collospermophilus l.l.
- 14.1 " " Stopped for 12 minutes. Chipping sparrow singing, picked up Indian point in forest by accident. Wilmer shot Collospermophilus (✓). Started again at 3:35
- 14.6 Single tree creek. Woodpecker (sp.) & robin.
- 14.8 Oak growth in evidence.
- 15.9 Several chokecherry.
- 18.9. Eutamias & yucca. Lupine & oak coming in good.
- 20.0 Ranger Station.
- 20.6 Pleasant Creek (diverted)
- 21.3. Birch, Spruce and good trapping valley.
- 21.7 Oak Creek Camp. A beautiful creek passes down through aspen. Oak Creek Reservoir about 2 miles west and good trail leading to it. met Mr. Bentley the Forest Ranger passing by on road. He had left Teasdale this morning & had gone up over
