

Set other series along bank of small spring that comes down the hillside about 100' north of the camp. The source of this stream is several hundred feet up hillside and comes down through aspens and entering the marsh lands by camp. Higher up along this stream bank one found willows and small logs. All traps were placed along creek side only a few inches from water in anticipation of determining the degree of migration up or down this creek of the microtus. The edge was lined with manes and a few willow. The 40' stretch of the creek trapped was 200' up hill above the marshes below.

George set his traps 100' below along same creek and collected 3 microtus & one chipmunk, which would indicate that they probably do not migrate very far up creek above their meadow habitat below. 90' is the high point up creek from meadow below.

Breakfast at 6:00 A.M. and sky without a cloud, no wind and looks like a warm day ahead. After breakfast began skinning & mounting and during the course of the day have made a few observations from the cabin door while at work.

(718 J.B) *Melospiza lincolni lincolni*. From cabin door watched two Lincoln Sparrows feeding on bare floor at edge of swamp. Collected one.

While preparing material at door of cabin a House Wren flew into building and after almost lighting upon my head flew over to window screen and after several fruitless attempts finally found the door ^{way} again and disappeared.

The Thrush, Junco & Robin fed along meadow. From the door way of the cabin have a commanding view of the marsh land. The edge of it come within 25' of door. To the right is a group of willow trees along edge of swamp while on the opposite side from cabin about 200' away is the east side of swamp & is lined with aspen trees. To the north and N.E. is the extension of the meadow area with the entrance of the creek from the west hillside on the west side and extending willow patch beyond to the N.E. From the entrance of the hillside creek the water flows down through a patch of willows by cabin among the meadow grasses and then swings back again to the north where it finally enters boggy area before crossing road.
