

8:35 While around fire heard trap go off in cabin and on investigation proved to be a *Peromyscus*.

8:40 One of Georges traps went off in meadow by cabin and held a small immature *Microtus*.

10:00 P.M. A Vireo (?) kept calling about once every half hour and lent a weird atmosphere to our camp fire.

10:10 P.M. Gasoline Lamp attracted a sphinx moth of a grey color. Collected this one and in 10' after its capture another flew into light and was also collected. No wind, few clouds in sky. 48° F. Another came about 2 minutes later and collected it also then to bed.

* Station 3 - 6/20/28 Steep Creek.

7:30 Shortly after sun up temperature 47° F. Skies overcast and hazy.

8:00 Lincoln Sparrow feeding along Swamp edge below cabin.

After breakfast left at 8:40 for Steep Cr Lake for trap line and arrived after moderate walking at 8:45 A.M. which is a short 5 minute walk. On arrival heard R.W. Blackbird calling and chipping, flycatcher was seen flying at blackbird while in air. No cast in evidence. *Eutamias* retreated from top branches of willow tree near edge of Lake.

Trap line reports starting from west end of lake.

24. Sprung. bait remaining. Placed at lake-shoreline contact among aspen tree and willow. Trap set at water edge on wet mud. Associated with *Ternus* and sedges.

23. (741 J.B) *Peromyscus*. Caught on lake-shoreline contact on wet oozy mud with black water soaked dead leaves on surface. Near aspens and at base of willow.

22. (740 J.B) *Microtus m. mordax*. Wet grass area 10' from lake shore contact.

21. (739 J.B) *Eutamias amoenus*. Lake shore contact. Under growth of willows on oozy black mud at water edge.

19. Sprung. Set in runway at edge of lake in grasses around base of willow clump. Dry grasses mixed among the green ones. Tall rush like sedge in standing water of lake.

18. (736 J.B) *Microtus m. mordax*. In runway among grasses on old willow mound bordering lake edge. Wet areas surrounding. Several holes in mound.

17. (371 J.B) *Ibid.* except trap set on oozy mud at base of willow clump. Female R.W. Blackbird carrying worms in mouth. male singing near.

16. Sprung. In *Microtus* runway at water edge.

15. Unaffected. By lake lateral among willows.

14. (738 J.B) *Microtus mordax mordax*. In runway in damp grasses on opposite side of willows from lake edge. Rice grasses and short sedges both dry land beyond.

13. (733 J.B) *Microtus m. mordax*. *Ibid.*

12. Unaffected. Lake lateral among willow in runway with standing water.

9. Unaffected. Upper grasses & sedges in trail beyond willows 10' or so.
