Peterson Feed, no birds. Temp. 54°F. Pulse end trip 54. On trip to 56.

April 1, 1980

Apparently cedar wrens have left area after cranberry resource exhausted about March 28, 1980. The last berries were gleamed from the ground. all berries gone from bushes.

April 1, 1980

Heard flock of snow and blue geese fly over house at 9:00 A.M. above cloudy sky.

Kaw River, Lawrence, Douglas Co., Kansas

April 2, 1980

Kaw River within 2 feet of flood stage at Lawrence from rains last week. Lawns in city just turning green.

Clinton Reservoir, Douglas Co., Kansas

April 4, 1980

Observed first turkey vulture at Clinton Reservoir near the dam. Others reported in newspaper March 15 someplace in Iowa. Clinton Reservoir need a wildlife viewing area and best place would be between ridge of headquarters and dam road and extending to and including bay area. Birds are too distant at S end of dam, other boat put-ins too congested and disturbed.

Peterson, Deerfield, Kasold Research Area, Lawrence, Douglas Co., Kansas

April 4, 1980

Surveyed area starting 10:00 A.M. at Peterson Pond. Grasses 10" high and weeds giving forest a greenish cast (2" high). Peterson Pond, bob-white, 3 grackles, robin. Peterson Creek 3 song sparrows, blue jay, ruby-crowned kinglet, blue jay. Raccoon track (rear) 1066 mm. Grackle Coast 3 robins, Osage Fence Row, G.H. owl flew to east.
