There appears to be no frogs in these meadows as I did not see or hear them at any time. A Callaspermophilus fed in dry spur on north end of meadow. Not wet but in damp & grasses area surrounded by meadowlands. Thrushes still singing here. Left for Station 4 and on arrival packed mammals and waited for George and Hilmer to come. They had left Station 3 this morning and were to relieve me until tomorrow morning. George was to run trap line this evening. They arrived at 8:20 A.M. Temperature then 57° F. Left for Station 3 at Steep Creek at 8:40 and collected a Marmota (780 J.B) in rock slide 270' north of Private Lake. It was heavily infested with fleas and collected many from its fur and preserved in alcohol. This rock slide is similar to the one found below Steep Creek Lake however it has a steeper slope than the one below but similarly surrounded by aspen trees. The boulders are larger than the ones below. It appears to me that two types of boulder accumulations are represented here, one a moraine deposit and the other a rock flow which seems to have been superimposed upon the glacial deposit. Collected the set of Lincoln Sparrow eggs and hit the trail for Steep Creek Camp. On way down made a few selective recordings. Followed more direct route to camp.

8:54 Audubon Warbler feeding in meadow below Coast Lake. Arrived at Coast Lake and heard a few frogs croaking in lake. Three bluebirds so far. Jays singing. Eutamias seen. Several Nuthatches feeding in aspen trees just above St. C. Camp. One sounded like a frog. Six Crossbills (?) flew by. Arrived at
