

Station 3 at Steep Creek Camp at 9:15 P.M. ³⁸⁰⁶²⁴⁻¹⁸¹ ^(792 J.B.) Set up equipment. and started to work.

The Lincoln Sparrow nest taken this morning at Survivor Springs was made of dried grass stems lined with small yellow stems and horse hair. Eggs fresh. Brake set and destroyed.

(774 J.B) *Callospermophilus lateralis lateralis*. Observed this mammal to run into hole on opening between Private Lake and Survivor Springs at about 4:00 clock yesterday afternoon, so placed trap in hole and did not catch until the morning after.

10:45 Heard raven calling. The skies were clear this morning but clouding up with slight wind around noon.

(779 J.B) *Microtus m. mordax*. Uterus normal.

(778 J.B) *Microtus*. Bladder measured 16. m. m. and contained a white albumen like matter in suspension occupying the lower 1/5 of sac. Testis measured 12. m. m.

(777 J.B) *Microtus m. mordax*. Bladder distended with white albumen collected at bottom in suspension. Testis 12. m. m.

(776 J.B) Embryos 3.5 m. m. Six in number.

(775 J.B) *Peromyscus*. Skull only.
Length 149 m. m.
Tail 61 m. m.
Foot 20 m. m.

Toward evening went to government point to watch evening shadows cross the desert country below. Hilmer Tanner returned from top of Aquarius where he had spent the day with George who was remaining above at Station 4 tonight. He reports 2 deer without horns at West Deer Lake.

One large porcupine, Spotted sandpiper, Am. Coot, Rail (?) and 12 mallards all at West Deer Lake.

6:00 P.M. Checked on Lincoln Sparrow nest 100' N.E. of Colim that I had under observation. It held 4 young now with their heads erect & mouths gaping. Windy tonight but skies clear. Bats flying before wind started. Temperature at 9:30 P.M. = 52° F. Still windy. Up to date no more re-occurrences of the night flying butterflies.

x Station 3-4 - 6/25/38 Steep Creek & Private Lake. Sun up at 5:55 A.M. Robins and House Wren singing at daybreak. Left at 7:00 for Private Lake to relieve George. and made complete census on way up.

7:02 A.M. Vireos singing among aspen along creek. Am following up hillside ^{from St. G. Park} toward upper platform. The stream follows up through aspen trees and is more boggy and swampy like than I supposed. House wren singing and hummer passed by calling.

7:05 The last part of House wren song similar to Spurred Towhee song.
