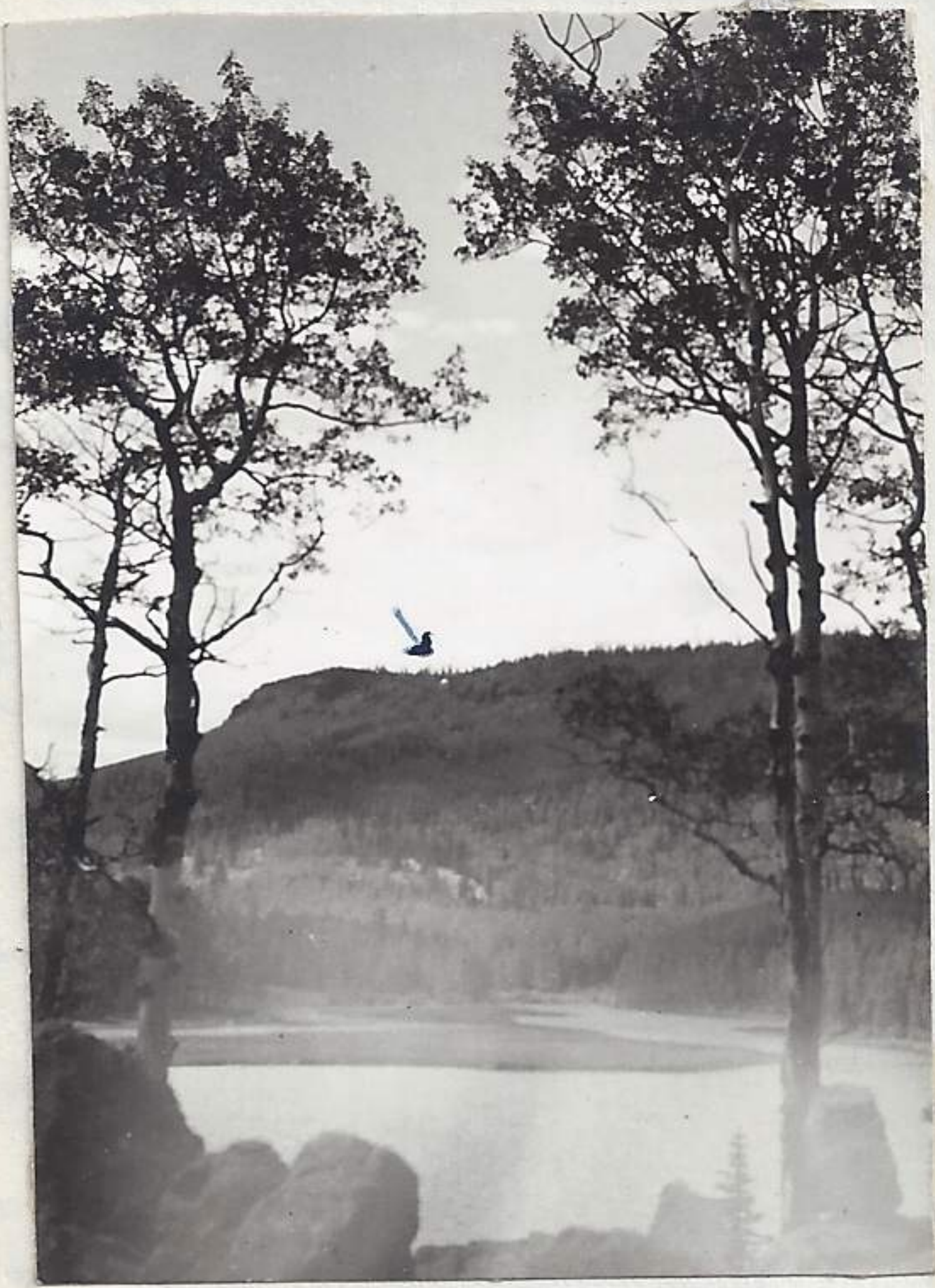


While the ♀ pursued back and forth in bay the young swam through bordering grasses to opening and then almost ran across water to opposite side of water grasses. Am. Coot calling.

The west bay is being invaded by grasses from the edges, but open channel still remaining from springs to main part of lake. at N.W. end of lake grasses on land bordering lake bent down and matted with crayfish vegetation about. Spotted Sandpiper calling.

2:00. At point where good volume of water enters lake from springs above, from here went 1 block south to small lake. It had *Pseudocoris* in it. While walking along lake edge to most southern side heard Wood Pewee, Vireo, Redwinged Blackbird and Spotted Sandpiper called frequently as it kept in head of me along shore line.

2:12. Most southern end where one would expect to find the outlet but not very well defined. From here continued to the east along shore line to rock slide protruding into lake from hillside. (2:15). From this slide photographically recorded the vegetative encroachment into lake at its western end and also indicating the channel kept open by the spring water issuing from the extreme west end of lake.

I watched a ♂ and ♀ deer feeding among the fir and aspen 100' to the east. The ♂ had horns and in velvet. Both had been feeding or drinking in lake below for they had

mud splashed against their heads & body. The mosquitoes were annoying to them and kept their tails, ears, feet and head in constant motion. They continued to feed until ♀ sensed danger and left on the run. Bewildered the ♂ followed. Left rock slide at 3:00 P.M. and returned to lake edge to continue. Ten juncos fed in one flock near shore. The robins sang frequently and up to now have seen 18 on trip around lake. Swallow flew over water but could not tell as to species for positive record. One Utah Jay fed in fir & aspen. A Phalarope (?) was seen in its characteristic flight along edge of lake in the distance. Nearing the east end of lake 8 mallards flew up from among the water grasses and flew west to other end of lake. The two deer seen at slide were just leaving east end
