

Arrived Humburg State Park at 827.5 at 7:21 P.M. Later in the evening we walked down creek to ocean and at w end of sandbar and observed the following birds:

 - 8 harbor seals in surf.
 - 3 red-throated loons
 - 12 western gulls
 - 3 cormorant
 - 1 Bonaparte gull
 - 40 northern phalarope
 - 2 common murre.

Left 827.5 at 10:12 P.M. 831.7 bald eagle along side of slope leading to ocean, 835.1 redtail hawk ^{circling} with mole in talons. 838.5 redwing. 842.7 now back on main road 101 after deviation to Ophir for gas, 855.4 Hunter Creek. 861.5 series of rocks in ocean support 15 Calif. sea lions and 25 harbor seals. wherever there are platforms on rocks above the ocean level one generally finds seals. 2 pigeon guillemots just before Meyers Creek. 862.7 redtail hawk, another one just beyond. Most of the gulls are the western. 864.0 Pistol River. 870.4 at Arch Rock Point. H6 took the following photos at the point. 820508-1 of surf breaking on sand and running up onto beach. white foam diminishes rapidly after momentum advance.
