

This high conglomerate, sand and clay cliff that faces the ocean has been deposited as an outwash plain in Pleistocene times and has eroded back by the ocean to its present profile. 972.3 *Citellus beecheyi*, 972.5 turkey vulture. 976.4 Steller jay. now in canyon the leads to 101. Arrived Patricks Point State Park and at Wedding Rock took several photographs: no. 820509-3 rocks to north. A Calif sea lion passed by between the outer rocks and the 2 nearer rocks. The body is clearly defined from our high vantage point. Before we left, another one, ^{northern sea lion} pass by in same channel. Photo 820509-4 to E showing eroded back of cliff and bay beyond. There were times when the ocean came to the beach without surf formation which is unusual for the perpetual surf action along the coast. Photo 820509-5 wave action directly below vantage point. Photo 820509-6 Annette returning to trailer from wedding rock. 12 pigeon guillemot fishing below point, single line formation common alignment in fishing maneuvers. Herring gulls, Brant cormorant, double crested cormorant, robin, northern sea lion, 10 Calif sea lions, distant rocks with sea lions but could not identify. Was impressed with lack of surf. Water breaks on rocks but to either side uninterrupted smooth water until hitting shore and then motion is aftereffect of contact and not a wave breaking as such. This would be an excellent spot to study at
