 jay, 1 red-breasted nuthatch, 1 western tanager. Collected
 pine cones of Jeffrey pine (like ponderosa with spines on scales
 and scales pulled out at top but about twice as large. The
 ponderosa is most common pine and Jeffrey say one in
 15 and characterized by unusually large cones at base on
 ground. The white pine or more likely the sugar pine
 produced the long thin cone and unbelievably long.

 lark and occasional duck. Arrived ^{Reno} at 483.0 at 2:06
 made quick check of town and after lunch continued
 E. 522.4 magpie just beyond Fernly at power lines.
 moving sands to N in Hozen Valley, and just beginning
 to creep up mts, along full length of range but sand
 has not gone over the top of range. 524.1 sand is
 created by a playa lake to the south. 527.2 Churchill
 co. 527.8 *Citellus tridecemlineatus*. Brewer black-
 bird most common bird along way. 534.4 area of lakes
 and 4 ducks overhead and 15 on water. Redwing black-
 birds, snowy egret, owlets, coot and other kinds of ducks.
 also 1 raven. Some ponds dry. 540.4 5 W. Kingbirds.
 fighting for position or nesting site on telephone post.
 543.1 magpie, W Kingbird. 544 Fallon. Drove out
 to Ray Alcorns residence W on telephone road. Ray
 not home but toured area. He has accumulated a
 tremendous amount of early pioneer antiques and
