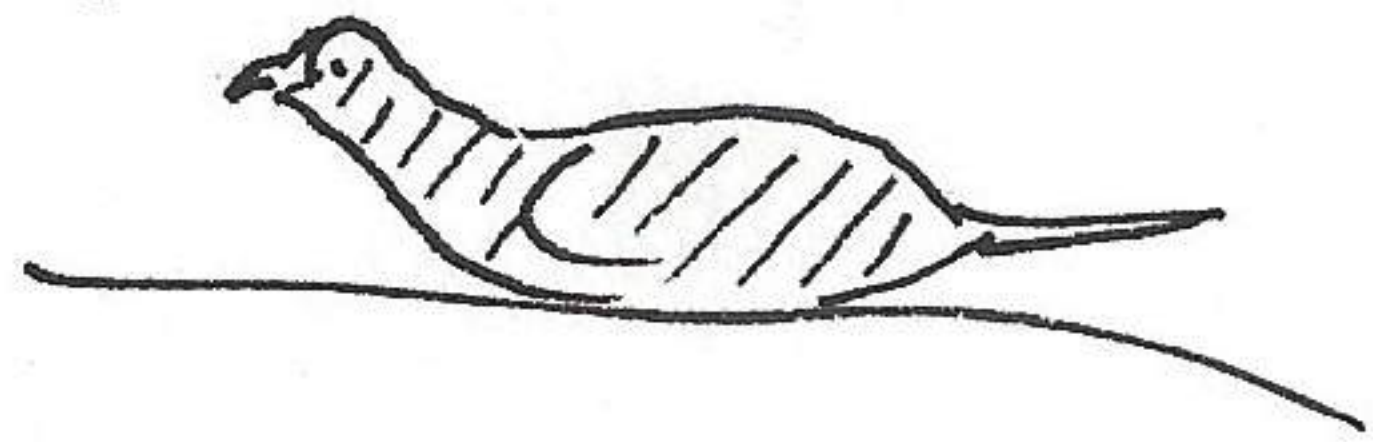

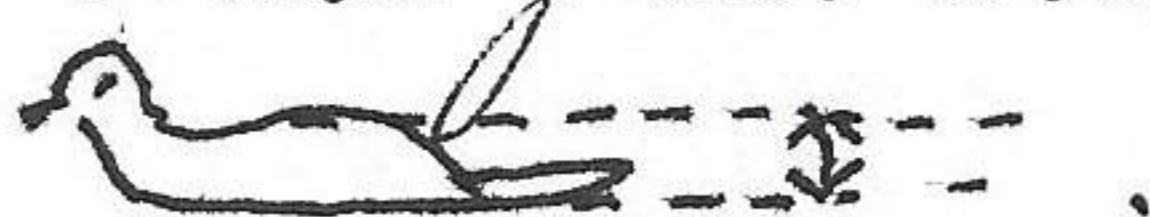

There were 15 tree swallows? at nest, flying into nest area and then out and above nest up to 10-30 feet as if catching insects attracted to the nest which with young eagles, is frequently covered with dead remains of the prey species used for food by the young eagles. Female left nest at 9:55 A.M. to E. 9:58 eagle returned. 10:00 eagle left and end of morning observation. 2 ♂ western tanagers fighting over ♀ tanager among trees. Goshawk observed sitting on top of dead conifer on top of Ashley Peak above eagle nest. From its position on top of peak it left and flew E across valley at great speed. Audubon warbler, western flycatcher, gray-headed junco, brood-tailed hummingbird, robin in area of moraine chalet. measured an aspen below Little Chalet at 48 1/2 inches in circumference. Drove down to Mary's in Provo at 15.8 miles from Little Chalet. On return to Little Chalet noted mule deer by creek at first switchback to left (S) below the chalet.

From porch noted golden eagle on nest at 7:50 A.M. ^{upper} Body half exposed. Sun on alternate nest (upper) but not on lower nest. Swallows active at nest site. 7:58 A.M. eagle stood up and backed to outer edge of nest and worked on carcass and fed young. When young eagles outstretched wings they were 1/2 length of adult eagle body and tail. Color of young eagles yellowish white except brownish black primaries and secondaries. Adult eagle left nest at 8:10 A.M. Young do not show while adults are away but when being fed are entirely visible and just short of height of back of crouched adult . This pair of eagles hunt
