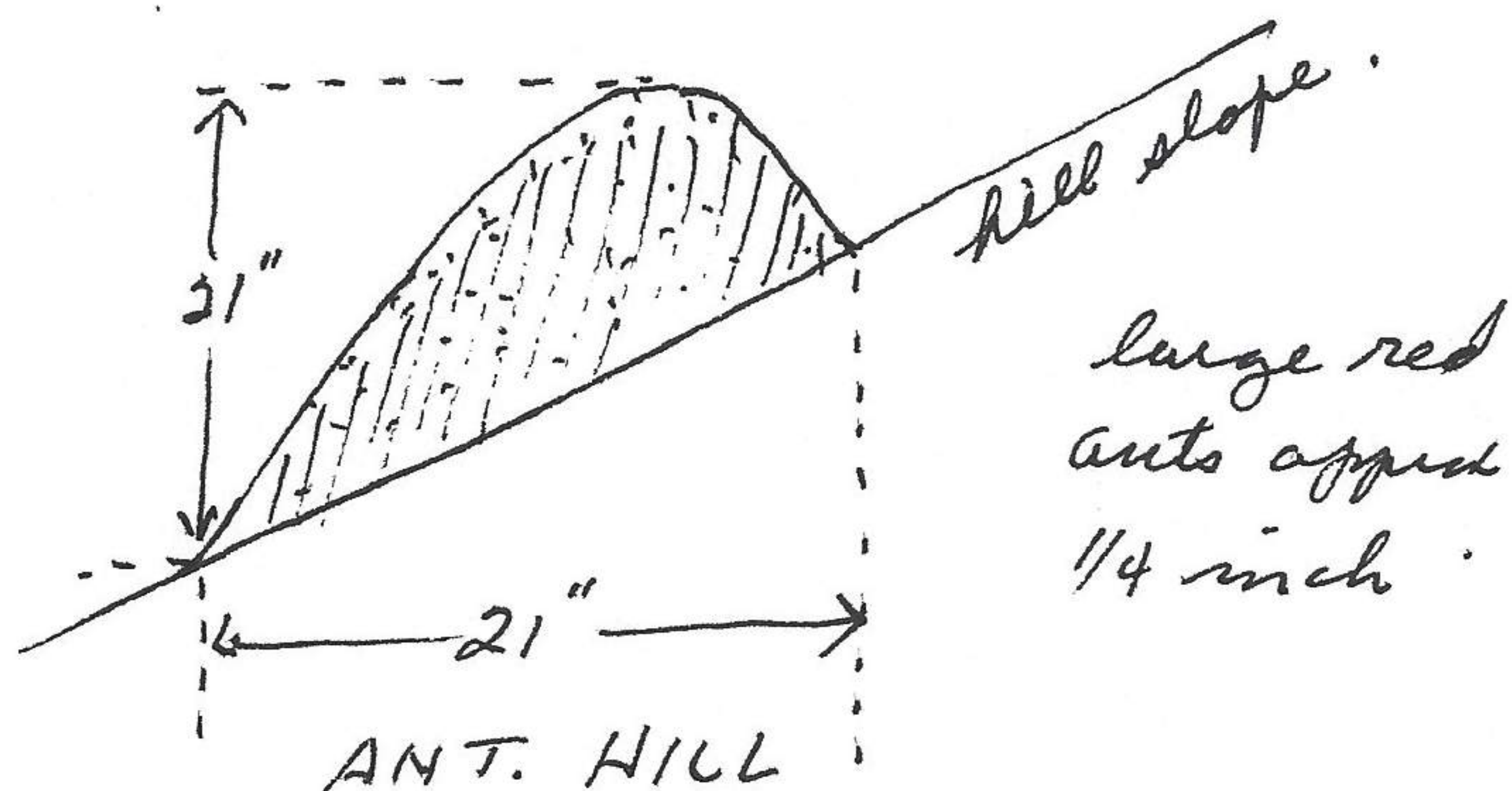


Citellus armatus, both producing approx. $1\frac{1}{2}$ bushels of soil each. 4:45 deer tracks measured 70, 80 mm.

Both gophers and ground squirrels actively digging and pushing excavated dirt in to surface of ground. From first divide of ski slopes just W of Deer Ridge traversed W exposure to Deer Ridge thru aspens and hillside brush. arriving at 5:26, thence down ridge thru conifers. ^{many} deer trails, especially among conifers. at base of Ridge before entering meadow measured a ant hill placed among conifers (Douglas firs). Large red ants were active over entire surface of nest or ant hill. nest made of fir needles and small twigs (needles of both *Pseudotsuga* and *Abies concolor*). 6:05



base hill and will continue down road towards Sundance. along way noted 2 groups of mourning doves, 1 of 7 and 1 of 2 birds. measured one deer

track 70 mm. 6:25 Sundance ski lodge. now up slopes to starting place. Enroute observed a solitaire (Townsend). Cows and debris, especially candy wrappers all along ^{under} ski lift up slopes. Users should be encouraged to deposit debris at terminals, not just drop from ski slope. 6:50 microtine trails in grasses associated with springs & wet places. noted at least 15 *Citellus* holes that showed new digging or housecleaning, each excavation of about a bushel or more of excavated dirt. On grassy slopes, grass gone around immediate circumference of hole. Hidden secondary escape holes still protected with grass. 2 robins and 4 mourning doves on slope. Arrived Little Chalet 7:15 P.M. High wind all day.

in Cascade formation. Aspen is the white barked tree.
